## About the course

The goal of this interactive education is to better understand the concept of Self-disturbance or Self-Disorders (SD) and its clinical - diagnostic, therapeutic and prognostic value.

Micro-experiences of self-alienation such as feelings of derealization, perplexity, depersonalization, reduced selfpresence, and alteration of the stream of thought i.e. not-yet psychotic experiences have been recursively described in detail in classical European psychopathology.

In the last two decades an explicit notion of basic SD has emerged as target for research and practice (including ICD-11 criteria). SD typically emerge in late childhood and early adolescence and therefore offer a suitable developmental target phenotype antedating the development of major schizophrenia spectrum conditions. It seems that it could be a central phenotypic marker of vulnerability to schizophrenia.

An ad hoc assessment tool has been developed which could help in noticing a suitable indicators antedating the development of major schizophrenia spectrum conditions.

This Course will be held in three parts. In the first part, introduction to the concept and its historical background will be presented. During the second part, case reports of first admissions patients with diagnostic uncertanities will be presented and discussed.
